SCOPE OF WORKS

CCG (Scotland) Ltd is the main contractor for a new affordable housing development located on Tweed Street, Greenock where a total of 69 family homes and flats will be delivered on behalf of Oak Tree Housing Association. Works commenced w/c 17th of August with completion expected learly-2022.

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SITE ACTIVITY


CCG has made good progress across the Tweed Street development since our previous update in the summer.

The site itself has significantly advanced with the installation of the buildings superstructure now complete across the development. This has allowed the site team to advance the application of external finishes including roof tiles, brickwork and Solar PV installation. In addition, CCG has also commenced hard and soft landscaping a Blocks 1-6 and these works will continue to progress throughout the winter period.

Over the course of the coming weeks, works will comprise the installation of street lighting, roads and footpaths at Blocks 1-6 as well as final decoration works which will commence in advance of first handovers at Blocks 1 & 2 which are set to take place in November.







CCG would like to advise community members that the increase in the number of vehicles moving to and from the site will remain for the duration of the construction programme. This includes large articulated lorries and personal cars belonging to site staff - please remain vigilant and take extra care. CCG have site-based protocols in place to minimise the impact of the works on your day-to-day lives which includes a strict working schedule as well traffic management with deliveries undertaken out with peak hours wherever possible. We will do everything we can to minimise disruption and apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused as a result of our construction activity.
